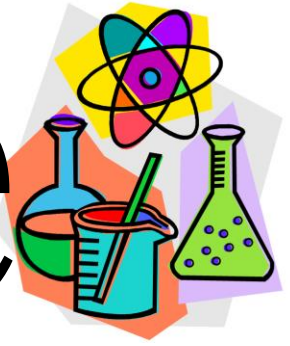


# Science

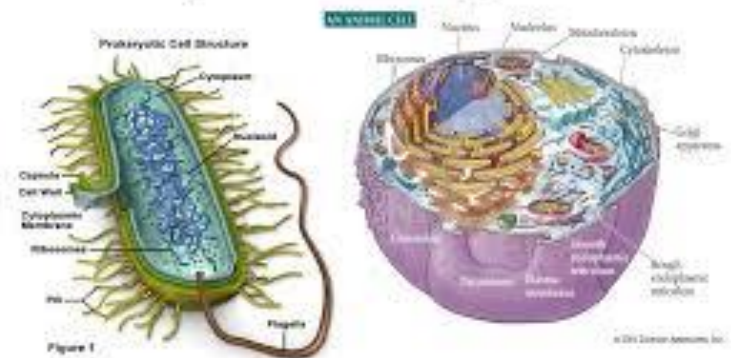


**April 6, 2018: Week 28**
